**Activity Instructions:** Pablo Picasso was one of the most influential painters of the twentieth century. He was a Spanish painter, and he was known for his evolving painting styles especially his portraits. Follow the link above and create digital portraits that look like Picassos paintings. Once you click on the link it will take you to the opening page you will see the words Picasso Head and to the right side there is a menu . Then you click CREATE, from there you will see on the right the tool menu and on the left your blank canvas. Use the tools on the right to create your portrait like Picasso. Look at the images of Picassos portraits above for inspiration and have fun!

### **Activity Instructions:**

### **Important definitions:**

- **Hue:** Color or shade.
- **Saturation:** How intense or vivid the color appears.
- **Complementary:** A pair of colors that are opposite of one another on the color wheel.
- **Analogous:** Colors that are next to one another on the color wheel. Analogous colors display visual harmony, which means that they look pleasing together.
- **Triadic:** Triadic colors are a set of three colors that are evenly spaced on the color wheel.
- **Tetradic:** Tetradic colors are a set of four colors that are evenly spaced on the color wheel.
